Christ restores Creation. The apostle must go and spread the Good News

Today, is the day we must go out and tell the world that there is a Man who for the last 2000 years has wanted to reedit Eden and who came just for this. Jesus is coming to restore, to recreate: "Oh lord, who in such an admirable way created all things, and in a more admirable way recreated them..."

The times we live urge us. We have no right to remain in a self-contemplating mood, to remain secluded in our own life... We hold no right to be at ease. We've got to leave our canvass and tell the world that Jesus is alive, and that He lives for them, for him and for her, for us all, and tell them in joy... even if one appears to be a fool at times. The message behind the Gospel is foolishness, says St. Paul. We've got to go and sow hope, we've got to go and search.

—The first thing Mary did after receiving the Good News in her bosom was to leave to serve. Let's rush to offer the service that we believe in the Good News: the Good news of Christ yesterday, today and forever and one day.
